#### **Parent Information Pack**

Once again we want to keep you as up to date as possible with what we do here at Pye Bank, so that you can support your child. We hope you find your Parents' Information Pack useful. We usually include a Calendar but this year things remain very uncertain in terms of events and parent groups. The other documents are a great reminder about different systems we have at Pye Bank. They will really help you support your child, so please take the time to have a look, alongside your booklet about returning in September, which we sent before the holidays.

### WORKING WITH PARENTS AND OUR FAMILIES

When we first come back to school in September, parents/carers will not be able to enter school or attend events as usual. We will keep all systems under review with the aim of getting back to normal as soon as is possible.

#### How will we continue to work with you whilst keeping everyone safe?

- Leaders will be outside each day to see the children in safely.
- You will have the topic Knowledge Organiser and it wil show you on the website what your child is learning in Maths and English.
- Any parent who is concerned or has a query can ring the office to arrange a chat with a teacher, member of the Pastoral Team or school leader. The office will ask you what your concern is linked to and make sure the right person contacts you.
- If any teacher has a concern linked to your child they will contact you quickly by phone for a chat.
- If following a phone call it is felt a meeting is important this will be set up and take place using social distancing using the Pastoral room.
- We will put regular messages on the website, Headteacher's Blog and class blogs and use texts to send prompts to have a look.
- Gold Award Assemblies will be uploaded to the Headteacher's Blog each week.
- As soon as it is possible to do so we will establish parent Forums and some coffee mornings, but will just need to have a booking system. We want to start these up as quickly as possible.
- We are keen to start using email much more for letters and communication so please let the office have your email address as soon as possible if we don't already have it.

### What will happen if my child's year group has to lock down?

- Although we hope this won't happen, if Public Health tell the school they need to close to a group
  of children or all children learning WILL continue. We have a system in place that would mean
  teachers immediately start working from home and after one day of closure staff would start to
  upload videoed lessons every day for Maths, English and one other subject. Children will send
  in work and staff will check this.
- We will send you more information next week and will be teaching your children how to access everything.
- A member of the Pastoral Team would stay in touch with you and pass any concerns about learning on to a teacher.
